JULY 15, 1996 MINUTES

THE ABERDEEN VILLAGE COUNCIL MET IN REGULAR SESSION WITH MAYOR GARY HIMES PRESIDING. MEETING OPENED AT 7:00 P.M.. ALL COUNCIL WERE PRESENT.

THE MINUTES FOR THE JULY 1ST MEETING WERE READ AND APPROVED AS READ. THE MINUTES FOR THE SPECIAL MEETING WERE READ AND APPROVED WITH ONE CORRECTION. (CORRECTION WAS ADJOURNMENT TIME).

MR. DUKE SNIDER ADDRESSED COUNCIL AND INTRODUCED HIMSELF AS A CANDIDATE IN THE UPCOMING ELECTION FOR COMMISSIONER.

THE BILLS WERE PRESENTED AND ORVILLE FRAZIER MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE BILLS, SECOND BY JOE ED HOWARD, ALL IN FAVOR. COUNCIL REQUESTED THAT THE COST OF UNIFORM SERVICE BE LOOKED INTO TO SEE IF THE VILLAGE COULD OBTAIN UNIFORMS AT A MORE REASONABLE COST.

MAYOR HIMES PRESENTED A DRAFT LETTER TO BE SENT TO RESIDENTS IN THE VILLAGE IN AREAS WHERE PARKING WAS A PROBLEM. JOE ED MADE A MOTION TO ADOPT THE LETTER WITH ONE ADDITION REGARDING EMERGENCY VEHICLES, SECOND BY DAVID WIREMAN, ALL IN FAVOR.

THE MAYOR PRESENTED A REQUEST FROM PAT KIMBAL, PRINCIPAL OF MANCHESTER HIGH SCHOOL, TO USE THE GYM FOR HIS CHEERLEADERS WHILE MANCHESTER'S GYM WAS BEING WORKED ON. THIS REQUEST WAS TO USE THE GYM WITH NO CHARGE. BILL ASBURY MADE A MOTION TO ALLOW THIS, SECOND BY JUNE CURTIS, ALL IN FAVOR. BERNICE JONES INFORMED COUNCIL THAT WHEN RIPLEY GROUPS WANTED TO USE THE GYM THEY WERE TOLD THEY WOULD BE CHARGED. THESE WERE GROUPS THAT ABERDEEN CHILDREN WERE MEMBERS OF. BILL ASBURY NOTED THAT ANY SPECIAL REQUESTS IN THE FUTURE THAT INVOLVED SCHOOL FUNCTIONS THAT CHARGES FOR USE SHOULD BE WAIVED AND COUNCIL AGREED.

THE BIDS FOR THE TELEPHONE SYSTEM FOR THE SCHOOL BUILDING WERE PRESENTED. BILL ASBURY MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE BID FOR \$3094 WITH COMPLETION DATE TO BE WITHIN 90 DAYS, SECOND BY DAVID WIREMAN, ALL IN FAVOR.

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JERRY LANG AND TERRY LANG REPORTED AS TO WHY THE FIRE DEPARTMENT FELT THAT THERE NEEDED TO BE A FIRE HYDRANT BETWEEN CLYDES AND THE OLD HUNTINGTON HOUSE. THEY NOTED THE MAIN NEED WAS TO BE ABLE TO BEGIN FIGHTING A FIRE AT EITHER PLACE AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE AND THIS COULD NOT BE DONE IF THEY HAD TO ATTACH LINE AFTER LINE SO THEY NEEDED TO BE ABLE TO ATTACH DIRECTLY TO A HYDRANT. ROLAND PAYNE MADE A MOTION TO INSTALL A FIRE HYDRANT, SECOND BY BILL ASBURY, ALL IN FAVOR.

ANGLES IN TRAINING DID NOT APPEAR AS NOTED ON THE AGENDA.

JOE ED HOWARD MADE A REQUEST ON BEHALF OF THE LIONS CLUB THAT THE VILLAGE PAY PART OF THE MOST RECENT ELECTRIC BILL FOR THE PARK DUE TO THE 4TH OF JULY EVENT INCREASED THE BILL ALOT. THE MAYOR RECOMMENDED THAT IN THE FUTURE A PRIVATE ORGANIZATION TAKE OVER THE EVENT. JAY CUTRELL INFORMED THE VILLAGE THAT THEY COULD PAY A PORTION OF THE BILL AS LONG AS THE VILLAGE OWNED THE PROPERTY. BILL ASBURY MADE A MOTION TO PAY 50% OF THIS ELECTRIC BILL ONLY, SECOND BY ORVILLE FRAZIER, ALL IN FAVOR.
